#### How to Download from the Internet

- 1. Make a Folder on the desktop for the file download:
  - Right action click on the desktop.
  - b. Scroll down to **New** and click on the right facing arrow.
  - c. In the drop down menu click Folder.
  - d. A new folder will be placed on your desktop.
  - e. The blinking curser is shown in the name are below the new folder and the name of the new folder **New Folder** is selected.
    - i. Type the name of the new folder before you click the mouse.
    - ii. Name the folder Downloads.
- 2. Start your browser.
- 3. Type the address of the download site.
  - a. Type: www.google.com
  - b. When the website opens, type the name of the website and click.
  - c. Type in the Search dialog box: glary utilities download
  - d. Click on the Google Search button.
  - e. Click on the first Glary Utilities. You should be at: www.glaryutilities.com
  - f. Find title that reads Glary Utilities 100% freeware.
  - g. Click on the Download
    - i. This will take you to a new page. Find the entry that says Glary Utilities Free.
    - ii. Click on the button that says: **Download Now**.
    - Don't click on the full version because you will be asked to pay for the download.
    - iv. A new window will launch: click on **Download Now**: tested spy ware free.
    - v. At the top of the page a **Tab** appears with a message about protect your security. Click on the tab line.

- vi. A Window will appear. Click on **Download File**.
- vii. After you click on Download File, a window appears with three buttons: **Run, Save,** and **Cancel**.
- viii. Click on Save.
- ix. When the window opens find the dialog box next the **Save In** and click on the down arrow.
- x. From the drop down menu chose **Desktop**.
- xi. Under desktop chose **Download** folder.
- xii. Find the button that says **Save** and click it. (You may have to click it twice.)
- xiii. And the file will start to download.
- xiv. When the download is finished you can either **Run** the download to install it or **Open the folder** containing the download.
- xv. The download will be in the **Download** folder so you can install it at any time.
- xvi. If you want to install it later, you open the download folder and double click the installer program: **gusetup.exe**

- b. CNET is a website where you can download many free and shareware applications.
- c. Explore this website to preview what is available.
- d. The class website has maintenance links for spy ware and virus protection that will direct you to download websites.

- 2. Open you web browser and type the web address for a search engine in the address dialog box.
- 3. Type a search request in the dialog box on the page of the Search Engine:
  - a. Rag doll cats
  - b. Volcanoes on Guam
  - c. Height of the Andes in Peru
  - d. Google and some of the search engines let you ask a question:
    - i. How many moons are around Jupiter
    - ii. How high is the empire state building
    - iii. What is: gobekli tepe
    - iv. Are dogs related to foxes and bears
- 4. You can have several choices when you use a search engine. The entries closest to the beginning of the list will have the information closest to you parameter.
- 5. Type the entries from #2 into the different search engines to compare enties.
